

Dearest Parents,


One of the goals we have at Nativity: Faith & Reason is to integrate our curriculum, beginning at the middle school level integration facilitate our students'



ability to see the connections between the subjects that they are taught and what they learn, thus aiding their ability to reason holistically about the subjects we teach them. Presently we are doing this with our seventh grade science and religious studies curricula. This month the students are commencing their studies of the theology of the body in their religious studies classes, with Mrs. Zubrinic, preparing them, from a Catholic view point, for their introduction to the human reproductive system in January with Sr. Eleanora. The culmination of this unit will be three days of discussion, with the boys and girls separate, in where they can address each topic with each teacher and a guest speaker in the field of medicine.

We enter the second week of Advent this weekend. The root of the word Advent is ad venire, "to come". The Church reminds us that this season prepares us once again for the coming of Christ who has already come into the world. So, Advent is really a time for *memory*, of purposely reminding ourselves and each other of our relationship with Jesus.

I hope you are able to make time for memory with your children in these days of Advent. Whether taking the time to light the Advent wreath and say a short morning prayer before heading out the door (I know, challenging), or a discussion at dinner, asking them where they saw God's presence in their day, or asking God at night to help you see Him in the day to come. - Nativity: Faith ਈ Reason


Rules for Submission:

VIRTUE OF THE MONTH

FIDELITY

The virtue the school is focusing on for the month of December is fidelity. Fidelity comes from the Latin root "fidere" which means trustworthy or true; someone who is is loyal. Those who live the virtue of fidelity are faithful: faithful to God, to friendships, to commitments, and even to things that require toil or suffering.

The saint of the month who lived the virtue of fidelity was St. Francis Xavier, whose feast we celebrated last week. Francis Xavier (1506-1552) is considered the co-founder of the Society of Jesus (aka: Jesuits), and like many of our saints, he grew up a in a prosperous family. After many significant encounters he chose a life of prayer, sacrifice and mission as a Jesuit priest. Through a series of events he was asked by his dearest friend and superior, St. Ignatius of Loyola, to take the faith to the world of Asia, to which he said yes, despite the sacrifice of leaving his friends and this burgeoning order. Albeit the many beautiful moments of his life, one most moving was his departed from Europe - knowing that he would never see his Jesuit companions again. Each Jesuit gave him a letter of farewell, and Francis taking the letters, tore the signature from each, sewed them together and fastened them to the inside of his tunic, close to his heart. He wore those names for the remainder of his life.

This is an example of the fidelity, of loyalty, that we set before our students this month; an example of faithfulness to friendships, to commitment, and to God.
