#### PTO MEETING MINUTES - WEDNESDAY, MAY 2, 2018

#### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 PM with a prayer by Chairperson Jamie Merrion. There were approximately 37 members present, including 4 officers.

#### CHAIRPERSON REPORT, Jamie Merrion.

- Mrs. Merrion introduced the candidates for the 2018-2019 school year, and each person spoke briefly about their families and current work in the school. Ballots were handed out to those in attendance. Voting would take place at the end of the meeting.


