#### Principal's Message

A woman was on her way to Easter services when her car broke down. Stranded and still too far to walk, she decided to call an Uber. The driver picked her up and they got going. He was silent, very focused on the road, so she gently leaned forward and tapped him on the shoulder. Suddenly, the man jumped and swerved—nearly hitting oncoming traffic! Shaken, he managed to pull over safely. "I'm so sorry!" the woman blurted out. "I didn't mean to startle you!" He took a deep breath and replied, "It's not your fault. This is my first day as an Uber driver... for the last 30 years, I've been driving a hearse."

We laugh at the misunderstanding, but that driver didn't expect life. He was used to stillness and silence...death. A tap on the shoulder was unthinkable-until it happened. It also reminds us of something true about Easter: sometimes, life can catch us off guard.

The Resurrection of Jesus caught the world in much the same way. No one expected the tomb to be empty. No one imagined death could be reversed. Even the disciples were confused, frightened, and slow to believe. But Jesus rose. Life returned. Hope stepped out of the grave.

The Resurrection means that death no longer has the last word. It means forgiveness is real. It means God is still writing the story. It means we live with hope—not just someday, but now.

So, let the Resurrection catch you off guard again. Let it shake loose your doubts and fears. Let it awaken you to a living hope that changes everything. Because the tomb is empty... and life is tapping us on the shoulder.

And because Jesus lives, we can live differently. We can choose grace over anger, understanding over judgment, joy instead of despair. We can forgive because we've been forgiven. We can hope because hope has broken through the grave. The Resurrection doesn't just change our eternity—it changes our today. Let's live like it.




