From the Desk of the Principal

Cell Phones

With Christmas right around the corner, now might be a good time to remind you of our policy of not allowing students to bring cell phones to school. The same is also true for student owned e-readers, Nooks, i-pods, i-pads, laptops, etc. But this note is specifically about cell phones.

There are so many ways in which cell phones create problems in school that I hardly know where to begin. Let's start with the fact that so many law enforcement officials and homeland security folks have shared concerns over misuse during an emergency. They find that so much false information is spread

that it impedes their work and often causes panic.

Today's cell phones have picture capabilities and recording functions. Kids often abuse these by taking photos of inappropriate situations and using them in an unsettling manner. We see no reason to invite such activity.

Cell phones are being used to cheat in many schools. Texting makes an easy method of quietly communicating some things that shouldn't be shared. We also find cell phones disruptive to education. Kids tend to be distracted by them and often miss what they should be hearing.

As with most electronic gadgets, cell phones are not cheap. Passing around, showing them to others, etc. often leads to a broken instrument. We don't need more of those kinds of issues to deal with in school.

Finally, cell phones are not necessary in our school. We have a phone system with voice mail, phones in all classrooms, extensions throughout the building, and voice prompts to nearly every corner such as latchkey. You should be able to reach anyone in our building very quickly in an emergency.

While it is understandable that not everyone agrees with this rule (or any rule for that matter), legal and moral law indicate a need to comply. The negative lessons learned by approving of a child purposefully disobeying rules could have very grave consequences for the child in the future. We pray that is never the case with our families. I hope that gives you food for thought.
