1604
St. Vincent de Paul was born on April 24, 1604, in the village of Pouébo, France. He was the youngest of 12 children. His father was a farmer, and his mother was a devout Catholic. He was educated in the local school and then in the Jesuit school in Paris. He was ordained a priest in 1628 and spent several years in the confessional. He was then assigned to the parish of St. Vincent in Paris, where he began his work with the poor. He was known for his compassion and his willingness to serve the most marginalized members of society. He was eventually canonized in 1900.

If, for some reason, it does not match your previous training to this account and you are prompted to register for a class, please register for "PREVIOUSLY ATTENDED-DATE NOT LISTED" and send an email to the address below. We will apply the correct training record to your account.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
