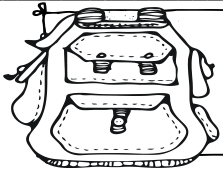

Religion: Chapter 11 "Jesus Teaches about the Kingdom" In this chapter Jesus teaches us that there is something more valuable than any treasure that we have. In the Gospel of Matthew, we will read two parables. These Parables teach us a lesson.

Lent: The kiddos are really filling our container with lima beans. They are focusing on finding all the good things that people do and all the acts of kindness that they do or see and place a bean in the pot. It is getting filled. We also are practicing not telling everything we did or what someone else did. We are keeping it between God and ourselves. Like the scripture in Matthew 6:1-6 and 16-18 says, you're praying and almsgiving and giving up things should be kept a secret. "And your father who sees in secret will repay you." Of course, they may always tell their parents. 😊 It will be good practice to keep it between them and God. 😊

They enjoy picking a different name each week and praying for that person in our class. On Mondays, they guess who had their name.

Math: We didn't get as far as I thought. We didn't take a test this week. The next week and a half we will learn to identify dozen and half dozen, measuring using feet, adding 9, identify one half and one third, and one sixth, using comparison symbols (<, >, =), dividing a set of objects by sharing, identifying quart, gallon, and liter. We will have a test on March 20th and the other one on March 22nd.

Phonics: We will learn to use er and est in words, (rule - for most words that end in y, change the y to I and add the ending) review the rule that when a word has two vowels together, the first is usually long and the second one is silent, understand and use comparative and superlative adjectives, and talk about context clue words. Memory words are down, too, work, many, first. The short story we will read is "Cass Takes the Cake." The long



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story is "Golly Helps." Our Super Smart interactive white board story is "Storms Ahead."

Spelling words are Say, may, play, happier, happiest, down, too, work, many, first.
